**ATT DWAR IS-SAHĦA PUBBLIKA
(KAP. 465)**

**Regolamenti tal-2022 li jemendaw it-Tieni Regolamenti
dwar Revokar**

BIS-SAHĦA tas-setgħat mogħtija bl-artikoli 26 u 27(ċ) tal-Att dwar is-Saħħa Pubblika, il-Ministru responsabbli għas-saħħa pubblika, wara konsultazzjoni mas-Suprintendent tas-Saħħa Pubblika, għamel dawn ir-regolamenti li ġejjin:-

1. (1) It-titolu ta' dawn ir-regolamenti hu r-Regolamenti tal-2022 li jemendaw it-Tieni Regolamenti dwar Revokar u dawn ir-regolamenti għandhom jinqraw u jinftiehm u haġa waħda mat-Tieni Regolamenti dwar Revokar, hawn iżjed 'il quddiem imsejha "r-regolamenti prinċipali".

Titolu u bidu fis-seħh.

(2) Dawn ir-regolamenti għandhom jidhlu fis-seħh fis-16 ta' Mejju 2022.

2. L-ewwel proviso għas-subregolament (2) tar-regolament 2 għandu jiġi sostitwit bil-proviso ġdid li ġej:

Jemenda r-regolament 2 tar-regolamenti prinċipali.

"Izda s-Suprintendent tas-Saħħa Pubblika tista', permezz ta' *standards*, tipprovdi għall-ħtieġa li tintlibes *visor* jew maskra medika jew tad-drapp:

- (a) ġewwa sptarijiet;
- (b) ġewwa kliniċi mediċi; u
- (ċ) ġewwa djar tal-anzjani u ġewwa djar għal kura ta' persuni b'diżabilità:".

**PUBLIC HEALTH ACT
(CAP. 465)**

Second Repealing (Amendment) Regulations, 2022

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by articles 26 and 27(c) of the Public Health Act, the Minister responsible for public health, after consultation with the Superintendent of Public Health, has made the following regulations:-

Citation and commencement.

S.L. 465.71.

1. (1) The title of these regulations is the Second Repealing (Amendment) Regulations, 2022 and these regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Second Repealing Regulations, hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations".

(2) These regulations shall come into force on 16 May 2022.

Amends regulation 2 of the principal regulations.

2. The first proviso to sub-regulation (2) of regulation 2 shall be substituted by the following new proviso:

"Provided that the Superintendent of Public Health may, by means of standards, provide for the requirement to wear a visor or medical or cloth mask:

(a) in hospitals;

(b) in medical clinics; and

(c) in old people's homes and in care homes for persons with disability:".
